Law enforcement agencies consistently cite training as one of their most critical needs, but many agencies lack the resources for training beyond basic recruit instruction. Through its national network of Regional Community Policing Institutes (RCPIs), the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) helps local law enforcement agencies meet their community policing training needs. RCPIs also offer some select community policing topics training to representatives from communities and local governments. This advances comprehensive and innovative community policing training to both law enforcement professionals and the communities they serve.

COPS Funding Affects Community Policing Training Nationwide

The COPS Office funds a national network of RCPIs, each of which represents an active partnership among a law enforcement agency, an educational institution, and a nonprofit community group. To date, the COPS RCPIs have provided training to more than 280,000 officers and citizens across the United States.

Each RCPI develops innovative curricula, quality community policing training, and technical assistance opportunities for policing agencies and community members. The RCPI network is accelerating the growth of community policing as a law enforcement management philosophy throughout the nation.
